The RACI Careers Development Programme is now taking applications for the 2022 Mentoring Programme for young scientists. With extremely successful results, both our mentors and mentees enthusiastically report their positive experiences, particularly in job-readiness and tangible outcomes.

Mentoring is very much a two-way process. As guidance, the ideal mentee will:

- Be enthusiastic about establishing and advancing your career;
- Be a student in 2022, preferably in your final year of study in the chemical sciences (undergraduate or postgraduate); OR
- Be an early career scientist in the first three years of your career;
- Actively participate in the mentoring process (approx. 2-3 hours per month)
- Participate in occasional networking events

You don't need to be the top candidate. You just need to want a good start into your career, and be willing to put in the effort to achieve that. The more you put in to the program the more you will get out of the program.
